TO THE WIVES OF THE OFFICERS & ENLISTED MEN OF THE 36TH DIVISION

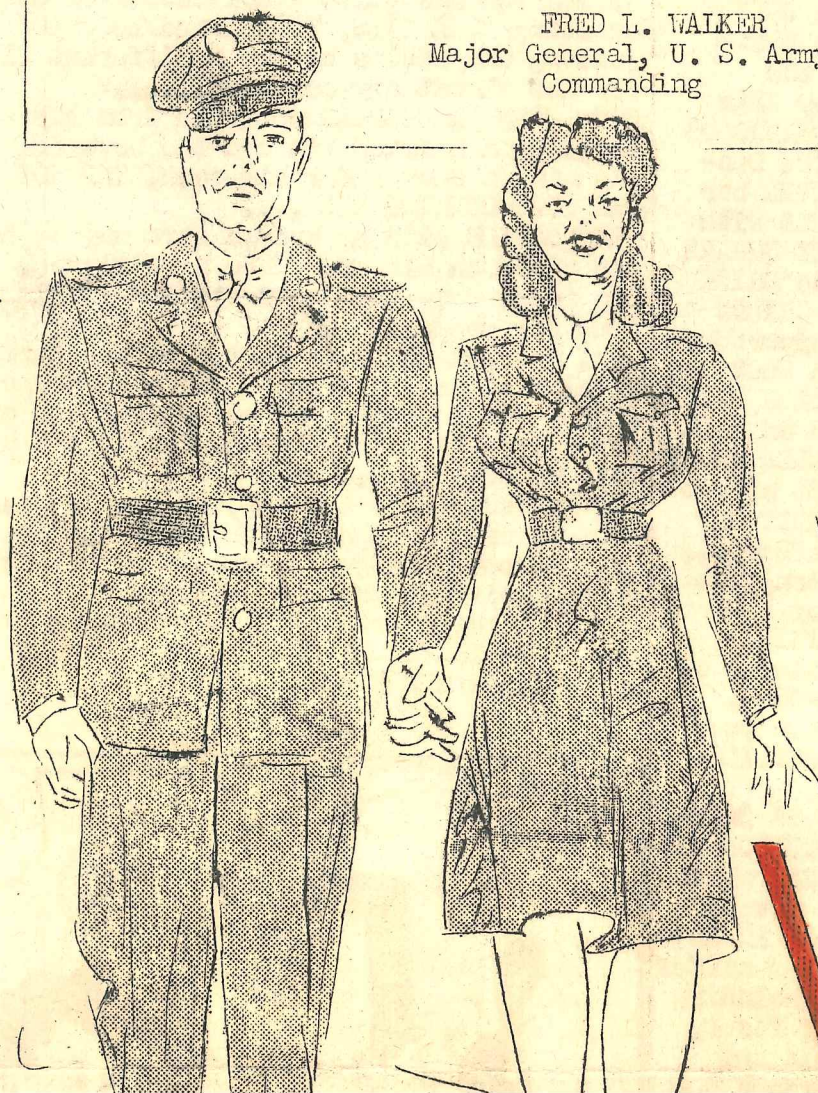

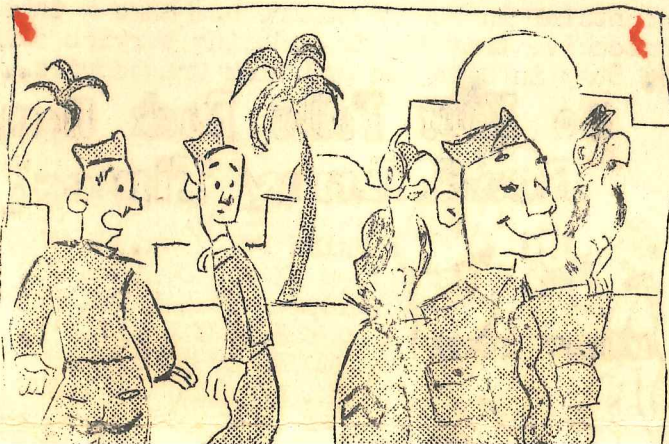
Has Co. B. found it's lost Bn...?

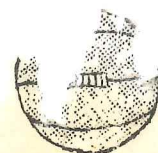
